RE: Global Goals NYC meeting

September 8, 2005

Dear Friends:

There are less than two weeks to the 12th global goals meeting which is to be held in New York City on September 17th - 18th at 777 U.N. Plaza. Here is an update:

1. If you plan to present a novel solution to a national or global crisis, please let us know the subject matter and the best time for your presentation. We will be meeting between 10:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. on Saturday and Sunday, the 17th and 18th of this month. Agenda information will be sent to everyone as soon as this information is received. Remember the four broad categories for our meeting: humanism, free-market solutions, media and government action -- national and international. Each idea will be allotted 5-10 minutes with a 10-20 minute discussion/analysis to follow -- we hope to cover between 25 and 50 proposals.
2. The luncheon discussions will be on the following topics: On Saturday, "How Nations and Individuals Can Prepare for a Pandemic, Such as Avian Flu;" and on Sunday, "How Cancer and other Diseases Can be Cured in 10 Years, Not 30."
3. We are still in the process of receiving RSVPs from interesting people. On Saturday we are expecting to have attendees from the U.N.'s Millennium Summit and on Sunday from Clinton's Global Initiative, so that we can learn first-hand the conclusions from those meetings.
4. Do not forget to let my assistant Chiara Szczesny ([cszczesn@stern.nyu.edu](mailto:cszczesn@stern.nyu.edu)) know if you would like a copy of "The New Global Goals" book to be over-nighted to you. It will give you an idea of some of the subjects covered at our goal-storming conferences in the past and the cost-benefit analysis that we will be applying to each solution that is offered.
5. Note the media coverage of the U.N. and Clinton meetings in the next week and some that we hope to receive. Chris Kling and I are pleased so many of you will be joining us at this important time. Let us know if you would like to invite a friend or colleague who has an interest in solving national and global problems -- we will make room at our large roundtable. We do not expect all attendees to spend the entire two-day conference with us -- please join us at your convenience.
